

# A poppy to Remember

The red poppy, also known as the remembrance poppy, symbolically honors the sacrifices made by fallen soldiers and veterans. The poppy was introduced in the poem "In Flanders Fields" by John McCrae, a Canadian physician and soldier. McCrae wrote this poem while fighting in the trenches of WWI in Flanders, Belgium. After the bloody battle, all that remained in the fields were the rows of makeshift crosses surrounded by poppy flowers. To McCrae, the poppies represented the fallen soldiers that were buried, inspiring his poem.

# This Day in History

- \*May 1st, 1924, as a health initiative to combat iodine deficiency, iodized salt became available to the public. \*

  \*May 3rd, 1952, the Kentucky Derby was aired nationally on television for the first time. \*
- \*May  $4^{th}$ , 1959, Ella Fitzgerald made history by becoming the first Black woman to win a Grammy Award. \*
- \*May 6<sup>th</sup>, 2023, King Charles III and Queen Camilla were crowned the first British coronation in 70 years. \*
- \*May 7<sup>th</sup>, 1945, Germany unconditionally surrendered to the Allies, marking the end of WWII in Europe. \* \*May 8<sup>th</sup>, 1886, Coca-Cola was invented. It was initially marketed as a cure-all medicine, not a soda. \*

May 10th, 1994, Nelson Mandela was inaugurated as South Africa's first Black president. \*

- \*May 11th, 1858, the great state of Minnesota, the Land of 10,000 Lakes, became the 32nd state of the nation. \*
- \*May 14<sup>th</sup>, 1904, the 3<sup>rd</sup> modern Olympic games opened in St. Louis, Missouri- the first to be held in the U.S. \*
- \*May 15<sup>th</sup>, 1942, states began mandatory rationing of gasoline & rubber, crucial resources for the war effort. \*
  - \*May 17th, 1943, the Memphis Belle, a B-17 bomber, completed its 25th bombing mission over Europe. \*

## Chaplain's Corner

#### Answered Prayers or Unanswered Prayers?

Did you have someone praying for you as you grew up? Maybe it was your mother or your grandmother. Maybe you didn't even know she was praying for you until many years later. Who you are today is a product of those prayers.

Sometimes we call determined praying people Prayer Warriors. They diligently and determinedly bring the concerns for people around them to the Lord.

Oftentimes our prayers appear unanswered; but the Good Book teaches that God knows what we need even before we ask. And according to the prayer Jesus taught us to pray, when we entrust the answers to Him, His will is done. We know we need to pray if we want any kind of answer!!

So, what do we do about unanswered prayer? This prayer is attributed to an Unknown Confederate Soldier who didn't receive the answer he requested, but later realized that God gave Him infinitely more than he asked.

### The Meaning Behind Memorial Day

#### Historical Background

- From 1861 to 1865, the United States was involved in a Civil War which divided Americans into Union and Confederate States. The war broke out due to many disparities among the northerners (free states) and southerners (slave states).
- Union states were headed by US President <u>Abraham Lincoln</u> while the Confederates elected their own, Mississippian Senator <u>Jefferson Davis</u>.
- Many able Americans were recruited to be soldiers, including farmers, mechanists, plumbers, and teachers. When the war ended it was estimated that 620,000 soldiers from both sides died.
- On May 5, 1868, three years after the war, Major General John A. Logan, head of the Grand Army of the Republic established Decoration Day which should be observed on May 30th. It was the time of year for Americans to decorate the graves of soldiers who died in the previous war.
- In the same year, Ohio Congressman, and later U.S President <u>James Garfield</u> delivered a speech at Arlington National Cemetery. It was attended by 5,000 participants who decorated the graves of around 20,000 soldiers who were buried there.

#### Decoration Day to Memorial Day

- Prior to <u>World War I</u>, southerners did not recognize Decoration Day. It was the northerners who observed the day with much enthusiasm. When Decoration Day was proposed to honor all soldiers, who died in any war, southerners embraced it.
- By 1967, Decoration Day was officially named as Memorial Day. Four years later, it was declared as a federal holiday and the date was moved to the last Monday in May for a longer weekend.
- On Memorial Day, people participate in and watch an annual parade. In addition, flags are flown at half-mast until noon, then to full mast until sunset.
- Wearing of red poppies is also a tradition which originated from John McCrae's poem In Flanders Field.
- It is also a popular day to visit the graves of soldiers and decorate them with flags and flowers. While others may choose to travel over Memorial Day weekend as it marks the beginning of summer.
- On December 28th, 2000, US President <u>Bill Clinton</u> signed the National Moment of Remembrance. Aside from the initial traditions, all Americans need to pause at 3pm during Memorial Day to honor and remember the sacrifice of American soldiers.
- In Washington D.C, the annual Rolling Thunder Run is observed to raise awareness of prisoners of war or those lost in action.
- Memorial Day is often mistaken with <u>Veterans Day</u>. The latter honors all US military veterans while Memorial Day honors the soldiers who died while serving.
