Leaving a Trail

Whether we know it or not, we are each leaving a trail for others to follow. What kind of trail are you leaving?

The fairy tale of Hansel and Gretel has become synonymous with **leaving a trail**. Thought to have originated during the Great Famine (1315-1321), the fairy tale weaves the story of Hansel and Gretel whose parents were so poor they couldn't feed their children. (That was before the time of county assistance for the needy!) Hansel and Gretel overheard their father reluctantly agree to his wife's plan to bring the children into the forest and leave them. Hansel creates a plan too and sneaks out that night to collect **white pebbles** that he uses to leave a trail so they can return home.

When they return home later their stepmother is upset. She still cannot feed them, so the event happens all over again. However, this time Hansel uses **breadcrumbs** to leave along the pathway. But Hansel and Gretel are not so lucky this time for the birds have eaten the crumbs, and they cannot find their way back home. After many twists and turns of fate, they eventually return back home to their father to discover their stepmother has died. Their father is delighted to see them and with the treasures of the wicked witch, they live happily ever after. The end!

The point is, what kind of trail are we leaving for others to follow? Are we intentional about leaving memories that mean so much to us? More than that, our lives leave a character trail. How do we react when under pressure? How do we respond to events that cannot be changed? How does one accept the unacceptable?
